Boldness. When you hear the word, what is your first thought? Do you think about politicians screaming at each other or publicly trying to blame the other side with their platform? Do you think of Star Trek and its opening line? Does it make you uncomfortable because we are so often told to be quiet and meek and don't hurt people's feelings?

Boldness is not the politician, it is not science fiction, and it is not wrong. Boldness is being innovative and having the courage of convictions while taking risks. Boldness is a characteristic of our Lord Jesus. Jesus walked the righteous path, even the path to the cross with the conviction of knowing His mission was to save us. Jesus didn't have to eat with sinners, but He did. Jesus didn't have to answer the Pharisees and Sadducees with the Truth, but he did, and Jesus didn't have to stand by and allow Himself to be shamed, beaten, spit on, and crucified, but He did.

Too often we take the path of comfort because it is easier than being bold in Christ. This is a dangerous game put forth by Satan that tempts us with instant gratification, pleasure, and comfort. C.S. Lweis in his book *The Screwtape Letters* tells us, "Indeed the safest road to hell is the gradual one – the gentle slope, soft underfoot, without sudden turnings, without milestones, without signposts." So, while it is easier to continue the path that you are comfortable in, have you asked yourself the question, where is this path going?

Boldness requires risk, for without it, one would not be being bold. Too many are afraid of risk. It paralyzes them, and they never reach the potential of all their God given gifts and abilities to do the work God has set before them. God's work is not safe, gentle, or comfortable, but it is right, and it is what God has justified and sanctified us for, to be bold in his name.

Boldness is stepping out in faith. This is why I am so proud to partner with Concordia Lutheran High School and their step of faith in their A Bold Step campaign. They are trusting in their Lord that He is a God of His Word and that He will bless them as they boldly look to the future. CLHS is stepping out on faith in order to position themselves not just to educate high school students into the future, but provide God's Word, God's Love, and to be a vessel of God's saving grace and salvation for generations to come.
